## Murderer Is Arrested

Found in the Blue Mountain By N. Y.

Authorities

Baker City Aug 15—Tracked from New York to the seclusions of the Blue Mountains of Oregon, D G Devling was arrested yesterday at Greenhorn for murder in second degree, the warrant having issued several years ago from New York. The arrest was made by Deputy Sheriff Snow of Baker county, and Deputy Steels of New York. Devling was brought down last night and is now confined in the Baker county jail awaiting the arrival of the extradition papers from New York. He was working for the Oregon Lumber Company at Greenhorn when arrested.

The crime of which Devling is accused is a very serious one. He was a railroad man in New York and loved a woman. Another man also loved this woman. Devling felt her slipping from his grasp and it is alleged concocted a plot to put his rival out of the way. Anyway, one night the rival was waylaid and assaulted with a lead pipe and peace of rubber hose. He was left lying beside the railroad track, as his assailants believed, dead. But the rival did not die, but was picked up and carried to a hospital, where he lingered for some time, long enough to tell what he knew about the attempted murder, and then died.

Devling and another man was accused of the crime but they had both fled the country. The grand jury indicted them and the officers started to find them. Through the efficient work of the Baker County Sheriff and his deputies, Devling was located at Greenhorn and an officer hurried from New York with the necessary papers and the arrest was made yesterday.

Devling has been working in the Greenhorn district for some time and while there conducted himself above suspicion. He will remain in the county jail until the necessary papers are made out when he will be taken back to New York.

## Wool Business

Six million pounds of wool, double the amount baled last season, marks the season's work at the Furnish warehouse for the year 1905.

This evening the last pound of wool in the warehouses will be baled and the doors will close upon the wool harvest to open the enormous wheat crop which is now rolling in by the wagon load.

This has been the heaviest business season ever enjoyed by the Furnish warehouse, in the wool balling industry. Two monster presses have been running constantly since April 25, with an average of 20 men employed during that time.

Last year only 3,000,000 pounds were baled and but half the force of men employed. Next year still more than this year's output will be baled as the business has expanded and reached out to new territory this season and secured a strong hold on the wool producers of this territory.—Pen dieton East Oregonian.
