O. R. & N. PLACES ORDER FOR CARS

This Means a Continuance of the Work
for Better Road Bed

Four hundred brand new cars will be the Christmas present with E. H. Harriman will present to the O. R. & N. this year, it is reported.

Two hundred of these will be box cars, 100 flats and 100 coal and ballast cars. Borrowing cars with which to handle an immense and constantly growing business is out of the question, for all roads are crowded to the limit and have few to lend.

So in order to meet the demand of the system, 400 new cars will be ordered, the first installment of them to reach the system about the first of the year, it is said.

The boxcars will be of the largest and latest model, carrying 40 to 60 tons, with steel frames and improved draw gear. The ballast cars will be traveling warehouses, from point of capacity, since most of them will be

100 ton steel cars, similar to those now in use on the Short Line and Union Pacific.

The order for these heavy cars means that enormous work in track improvements will be carried on by the system, as this number of ballast cars will equip five or six work trains and keep two or three steam shovels at work constantly.

The car factories are rushed to the limit of their capacity and it may be a year before the entire order for new cars is turned out from the shops, but as fast as they are completed they will be sent the system and put in service.

Within the past two years the O. R. & N. has received 30 new engines, principally for the mountain division out of La Grande, this being the largest number received by any western road in that time.

The matter will be settled in the September term of Union county court.

Tacoma, Wash., Aug. 23.—A. F. Kees, warden of the state penitentiary, arrived in the city today on his way to Olympia to confer with Governor Mead relative to the recent trouble that has resulted in the governor's order to dismiss eight of the prison guards implicated in an alleged attempt at illegal registration in Walla Walla. Whether or not the warden will go counter to these orders is not known. Some of his friends advised him to do so. He himself refuses to outline his policy. He declares his belief in the guards' innocence of any intentional wrong doing. He does not want them dismissed if there is any way to avoid it.

Summer Schedule

The summer schedule of the Astoria & Columbia River Railroad has been inaugurated between Portland, Astoria, Gearhart and Seaside in connection with special round trip excursion tickets to all Clatsop and North Beach points, and trains leave Union Depot at 8:00 a. m., daily and run through direct, arriving at Astoria at 11:30 a. m., Gearhart 12:30 p. m. and Seaside at 12:30 p. m.

The Portland and Seaside Flyer leaves Union Depot every Saturday at 2:30 p. m., arriving at Astoria 5:50 p. m. and runs through direct, arriving at Gearhart 6:40 p. m. and Seaside at 6:50 p. m.

In connection with this improved service, special round trip season excursion tickets are sold from Portland to all Clatsop and North Beach points at rate of \$4.00 for the round trip, good for return passage until October 15th.

Special commutation tickets, good for five round trips, are sold from Portland to same points for \$16.00, good to return until October 15th.

Saturday special round trip excursion tickets from Portland to all Clatsop and North Beach points on sale every Saturday at rate of \$2.50 for round trip, good to return Sunday.

Tickets sold from Portland to North Beach points are issued in connection with the O. R. & N. steamers from Astoria, and baggage is transferred to and from depot and steamer dock at Astoria free of charge, and all tickets sold by the O. R. & N. Co. from Portland to Clatsop and North Beach points, are interchangeable and will be honored on trains of this company in either direction between Portland and Astoria.

Tickets sold at all O. R. & N. stations and passengers wishing to go to points on Clatsop Beach should so specify, in order to avoid confusing this popular resort with that of Long Beach, Wash., which is reached only by boat at Astoria, thus causing delays enroute.
