## TO BUILD A NEW BRIDGE AT UMATILLA

**O. R. & N. Making Railway Improvements All Along Line**

Sixty-five thousand dollars will be the total cost of the new steel bridge which is now being planned by the O. R. & N. for the Umatilla river at Umatilla junction, says the East Oregonian.

The present bridge across the Umatilla at that point has been in service for a number of years and while in excellent condition and not in the least impaired by traffic, yet it is deemed to be insufficient for the immense engines and heavy trains that are being run over the entire system.

The bridge is about 350 feet in length, consisting of two short spans which are really approaches to the main bridge, with two spans in the center resting on an immense concrete pier in the river bed.

The present bridge is an overhead bridge, and when built was several years in advance of other bridges in the northwest, but it has now been surpassed by the more modern steel bridges which have been built on the system in the past three years.

The new bridge which is being planned by the bridge and building engineers will be of steel throughout, with possibly no overhead frame. It will rest upon the concrete pier in the center which was erected for the present bridge, and which will stand as long as the bottom to the Umatilla river stands. The estimated cost of the elegant new structure will be \$65,000 and it will be the most expensive improvement to be made at any one point on the line in eastern Oregon.

Bridge No. 145, two miles west of Meacham cost about \$75,000, but this included an immense amount of concrete and rock work which was necessary before the bridge could be put in place. The main expense in the bridge over the Umatilla will be in the actual construction of the bridge as the preliminary work is now complete.

The O. R. & N. bridge over the John Day river will also be improved perhaps this season.

## TWO ADDITIONAL TRAINS NOW ON

Commencing last night, Nos. 5 and 6 the west and eastbound main line passenger trains on the O. R. & N. will run in two sections between Portland and Huntington, making practically another regular main line train between those points.

Agent E. C. Moore of the O. R. & N. today received the bulletin to this effect and official notice is given the public. The first section of the trains in question will carry mail, tourist Pullman and dining cars, the second section to have baggage cars and coaches.

This is in answer to the demand for an extra train and it is hoped will be satisfactory to the people along the line in Oregon and Idaho. The arrangement will continue as long as traffic is heavy and the public will be governed accordingly. It will be noticed that only the first section carries mail and only the second section carries day coaches.
