The people of Oregon are just now talking and guessing far more about who will be appointed U S judge for Oregon, an office that concerns very few than about county roads that effect the home life of every man woman and child in the state.

No prudent man would turn his property over to be managed by his employees, and pay no more attention to it, only to give friends good positious with fat salaries which he must pay, without any consideration as to the need or value of the service rendered or of the way it is performed. #### **OREGON SCHOOLS**

In 1902 Oregon had 112,047 children from five to eighteen years of age and that year expended \$1,802,227 for her public schools being \$16 08 per child. The same year Washington on our north had 156,270 children from five to eighteen years of age and her total expenditure for public schools that year was \$2,805,455 being \$17.95 per child and one dollar and eighty seven cents per child more than Oregon paid. Idaho on our east in 1902 had 51,700 children of from five to eighteen years of age and that year expended for her public schools ing \$13.33 per child. California on our south in 1902 had 351,-600 children from five to eighteen years of age and expended that year \$7,613.708 for her public schools being five dollars per child more than Oregon expended that year.
