SHORTAGE MADE GOOD

Pendleton, Aug. 20—Clark and Buchanan, expert accountants who have been going over the books of Sheriff Taylor's office for the past six weeks, filed their report with the county court today showing the total shortage for the past seven years to be \$9,051.88. Of this amount \$5,672 was during the term of William Blukely. The entire shortage was made good by Sheriff Taylor today by paying over \$1,479.76 into the treasury. Blukely paid his money as soon as he was notified of the exact amount. Taylor is out \$3,381 of his own personal money which he was compelled to put up.

Anent the New Railroad

The work of extending the railroad to the mouth of the Willows river by the O R & N company, is still in progress and quite a large force of men are employed in the work.

A steam shovel and crew has been at work all week on the gravel bank at the end of the old track and have been experiencing considerable difficulty in removing the embankment, the composition of which is gravel and cement. The steam shovel which works very successfully in soft dirt does not work to an advantage in this cemented gravel and it is also very difficult to blast it out.

Two other crews are at work further down the river, one of them clearing the right of way and the other blasting out the rocky points. Mr. McCabe, the contractor, expects to daily increase the force of men.

F. A. Worthington, for the O R & N Co. and W. J. Cook, for the W V R R Co., are scrapping over the right of way in Willows county.—Elgin Recorder.

THE CHOLERA IN PHILIPPINES

Manila, Aug. 20.—An outbreak of cholera in Manila has been reported. Two soldiers died at Camp McKinley, which is now quarantined. In the city several natives, and one American woman have died. Surgeons state that the disease is not serious.

The Union county members are W. I. Dishman, W. G. Hunter and Peter McDonald. The society is organized by the election of W. G. Hunter, president; Fred Holmes, secretary, and Will Charob, treasurer. It is the intention of the commissioners to organize and hold a county fair this year at Lostine the last week in September, in connection with the fair undertaken by the town of Lostine.—Chieftain.

CROWDS HEAR MORMON CHOIR

Portland Aug. 20—The Mormon choir of Ogden Utah, sent here at an expense of \$10,000 by the citizens of Ogden and the Utah Lewis and Clark commission to participate in the celebration of Utah day at the exposition, has been accorded a reception unprecedented in this city. Considerable damage is reported by fire on the sugar company and Hutchison places, southward of town this week. Fire set out in the willows to clear a new road has burned into fields and done much damage by burning pasture, hay, fencing, shelter, etc. Two hundred tons of hay burned in one place. Some damage suits with the county as defendant, are among the possibilities. People interested claim that the county officials were notified and neglected or refused to look after the fire. A large force of men had been at work fighting the fire on the sugar company's land this week.—Republican.
