THE BIG CARNIVAL AT PORTLAND FAIR

Exhibitors at the Exposition will hold
Three Days Reception

FOR KING NOGERO AND HIS QUEEN

Portland, Aug. 8.—There is to be a three days carnival at the Lewis and Clark Exposition which will put in the shade every enterprise of the sort ever conducted in the Northwest, and will make the Mardi Gras, the big winter carnival held at New Orleans, look to its laurels. The carnival is to be known as "The Festivities of King Nogero I," and will last three days and nights, September 7, 8, and 9, every day being replete with spectacular features. For the purpose of inciting interest, the management of the Exposition has awarded prizes amounting to \$500, and nearly every exhibitor in the palace of manufactures, Liberal Arts and Varied Industries will give merchandise or money. The total number of prizes will aggregate \$5,000. These latter prizes are to be given away twice daily, and every visitor to the Fair will have a chance to draw one or more of them. A coupon will be given to each visitor as he enters the grounds, and the winning numbers will be posted about the building and may be obtained by proving ownership.

In the festive features, King Nogero I—his name, by the way, is merely Oregon spelled backward—Queen Columbia, and 100 maids of honor will take the principal parts. The maids

of honor will be chosen from many cities in Oregon, Washington and Idaho. For the first night's festivities the program provides that Queen Columbia in her royal barge and the maids of honor in a flotilla of gondolas shall arrive from across Guild's Lake at the boat landing at the foot of Lakeview Terrace at 8 o'clock, there to be met by King Nogero and his courtiers and royal band. The court will then pass in parade up the Grand Stairway, to a reviewing stand on Lakeview Terrace, where the king and queen will review an elaborate procession of gayly decorated automobiles, carriages, tallyhoes and other vehicles. For the best decorated outfit, the Exposition has offered \$150 in prizes.

On the second day the feature of the celebration will be a grand masque carnival, on a scale not heretofore attempted in the West. The masquers will meet at the head of the Grand Stairway at eight in the evening, and proceed to the Trail, where they will pass in review before the king and queen. After the review the masquers will mingle with the crowds on the Trail, and there will be confetti throwing and a general carnival of hilarity. The prize money for the best groups and individuals among the masquers aggregates \$320.

Farmers are not disposed to sell at the present quotations and though they have been threatened of a worse drop they are of the opinion that the market will improve within the next few days. But few sales were reported Saturday.

Summer Schedule

The summer schedule of the Astoria & Columbia River Railroad has been inaugurated between Portland, Astoria, Gearhart and Seaside in connection with special round trip excursion tickets to all Clatsop and North Beach points, and trains leave Union Depot at 8:00 a m, daily and run through direct, arriving at Astoria at 11:30 a m, Gearhart 12:20 p m and Seaside at 12:30 p m.

The Portland and Seaside Flyer leaves Union Depot every Saturday at 2:30 p m, arriving at Astoria 5:50 p m and runs through direct, arriving at Gearhart 6:40 p m and Seaside at 6:50 p m.

In connection with this improved service, special round trip season excursion tickets are sold from Portland to all Clatsop and North Beach points at rate of \$4.00 for the round trip, good for return passage until October 15th.

Special commutation tickets, good for five round trips, are sold from Portland to same points for \$16.00, good to return until October 15th.

Saturday special round trip excursion tickets from Portland to all Clatsop and North Beach points on sale every Saturday at rate of \$2.50 for round trip, good to return Sunday.

Tickets sold from Portland to North Beach points are issued in connection with the O R & N steamers from Astoria, and baggage is transferred to and from depot and steamer dock at Astoria free of charge, and all tickets sold by the O R & N Co from Portland to Clatsop and North Beach points, are interchangeable and will be honored on trains of this company in either direction between Portland and Astoria.

Tickets sold at all O R & N stations and passengers wishing to go to points on Clatsop Beach should so specify, in order to avoid confusing this popular resort with that of Long Beach, Wash., which is reached only by boat at Astoria, thus causing delays enroute.
