Have Nobles Terrorized

St Petersburg Aug 29—There is a great increase in the agrarian agitation in various parts of the country, notably in the Caucasus, where there have been serious disturbances. In the Gori district the peasants are forcing the nobles, under the menace of death, to announce to the newspapers that they are handing over their holdings to the peasants freely or are accepting one tenth instead of one quarter of the crop yield. The refusal of the peasants in the village of Inchedan to pay Prince Inukhansky the proportion of the crop to which he was entitled led to a serious conflict between the peasants and Cossacks. The Cossacks fired on the peasants, killing and wounding, according to an official account, 19, and according to an unofficial account, 70. Peasants from the mountains came to the assistance of the villagers, resulting in fresh conflicts, in which one Cossack was killed. Prince Inukhansky himself had a narrow escape from shots fired at him.

CONDITIONS OF RELAY RACE

There must be three starters. Riders must go four miles each day, changing horses every mile. Race begins Tuesday afternoon. Best total time for 20 miles wins

First Money, \$200; \$100 for Second; \$50 for Third;

Entries for this race required to give name of rider, names and description of the four horses they will ride, and file the same with the secretary. After the race starts no substitution of horses will be allowed except in case of accident, and then on the decision of the judges. Riders will be allowed two attendants for their mounts, and will each have a paddock to hold four horses, no assistance will be allowed in mounting. Horses for relay race will be on the grounds before noon of Oct. 2, for inspection by judge. Use of track permitted preceding the week of fair at hours prescribed by track manager. No entrance fee.
