LOST CABIN MINE FOUND AT LAST

Dispatch From Wyoming Says it Has
Been Located

Sheridan, Wyo., Aug 30—Much excitement has been caused here by the statement of three reputable business men, George H. Cutler, Thomas J. Mitchell and Carl K. Kneisel, who believe that they have found the famous Lost Cabin mine, near the summit of the range of the Big Horn mountains, between the heads of Little and Big Goose creeks, 30 miles from Sheridan. The scene of the discovery is located in one of the wildest spots imaginable, and prospectors must scale steep cliffs and crawl up treacherous trails en route. Cutler and Mitchell were on a hunting trip when they encountered a dilapidated, broken down cabin in a spot seldom traversed by man. In the hut were found newspapers 25 years old. There was a tunnel and a quantity of ore on the dump. Specimens of this ore which were brought to Sheridan are heavy with gold and a metal believed to be platinum. The yellow metal is plainly visible to the naked eye.

The men have been making trips to the scene of their discovery and it is rumored that they have staked out numerous claims in the vicinity of the cabin.

For many years a tradition has existed that the Lost Cabin mines were located somewhere in the Cascade mountains, and parties from The Dalles and other towns have started out time and again to find these rich deposits. It is over twenty years ago that Mr. Sam L. Simpson wrote a very interesting and romantic story about the Lost Cabin in the Overland Monthly of San Francisco. Of course it was romance; but was supposed to have had for its basis many actual facts. Over fifteen years ago, we listened with a great deal of interest to an old prospector who claimed to have discovered the Lost Cabin somewhere in the vicinity of Mt. Adams. He went some time in the cabin; but snow falling very heavily he was forced to leave or he would have been imprisoned there all winter. When he left the snow was three or four feet deep, and he was endeavoring, when he had this conversation with us, to organize a party to retrace his steps, if possible to the "Lost Cabin".

IS CHARGED WITH MURDER

Boise City Aug 31—William West, who shot and killed L. Lafont, a former resident of Boise, at Roosevelt last month and who was liberated by a coroner's jury, is again under arrest on an information filed at Grangeville by the prosecuting attorney of Idaho county, charging him with murder.

West was arrested on Monday at Pine by Deputy Sheriff Winters of Elmore county and he is now in custody at Mountain Home. The sheriff of Idaho county was expected in Mountain Home last night to take charge of the prisoner.

There has been a good deal of dissatisfaction over the action of the coroner's jury in turning West loose. Officials and others who have investigated the matter declare West guilty of murder.

Fruit Seized

Salem Oregon Aug 31—County Fruit Inspector Armstrong has within the last few days seized several tons of fruit which were infected with San Jose scale, and which had been placed on the market. The fruit seized consisted of pears and apples and was all raised near Salem. The most of it was destroyed, but some was returned to the growers. The Salem grocery men are cooperating with the inspector in his efforts to stop the sale of infected fruit, and they will no doubt succeed in so doing.

Narrow Escape

Pendleton, Ore., Aug 31—Henry Hill had a narrow escape from being torn to pieces while working around a threshing machine near Helix yesterday. His sleeve became caught in the cylinder, but he managed to pull himself away in time. Beyond a few bruises he escaped unharmed.

Street Car Accident.

Los Angeles, Aug. 31—A Santa Monica street car jumped the track at Sixteenth and Burlington streets tonight and 47 passengers injured, several seriously.

Good Yields of Grain.

Reports from the north end of the valley are very flattering on the grain yield. T. T. Glenn harvested 2100 sacks of wheat from 150 acres and Elmer Woodell harvested 2100 sacks from 135 acres instead of 2125 from 150 acres as at first reported.

Idaho Jail Delivery

Pocatello Aug 31—There was a daring jail delivery here last night resulting in the escape of six prisoners, awaiting trial for various crimes before the district court.

The prisoners who succeeded in getting away consist of five colored men and one white. The men were in the corridor at the time Jailer David Quigley made his rounds. Without a moment's warning they pounced upon him, beat him on the head and threw him into a cell locking the door. The rest was easy. They walked out, apparently boarded a freight train and got out of town. The first known of the jailbreak was an alarm raised by a jailer residing near the jail who heard a shot fired by the jailer to attract attention.
