Entrys for this race required to give name of rider, names and description of the four horses they will ride, and file the same with the secretary. After the race starts no substitution of horses will be allowed except in case of accident, and then on the decision of the judges. Riders will be allowed two attendants for their mounts, and will each have a paddock to hold four horses, no assistance will be pllowed ip mounting. Horses for relay race will be on the grounds before noon of Oct. 2, for inspection by judges. Use of track permited preceeding the week of fair at hours prescribed by track manager. No entrance fee.
