RELAY RACE FOR LADY RIDERS Ladies only, Purse $\$ 3.50$ conditions of relay race

There must be three atarters. Riders must go four miles each day, changing horses every mile. Race begins Tuesday afternoon. Best total time for 20 miles wins
First Money, \$200; \$100 for Second; \$50 for Third;
Entrys for this race required to give name of rider, names and degcription of the four horses they will ride, and file thy same with the secretary. After the race atarts no substitution of horses will be allowed except in case of accident, and then on the deciaion of the judges. Riders will be allowal two attendants for their mounts, and will each have a paddork to hold four horses, no assistance will be pllowed ip mounting. Horses for relay race will be on the grounds before noon of Oct. 2, for inspection by judges. Use of track permited preceeding the week of fair at hours prescribed by track manager. No entrance fee.
