Hot on Trail of Cattle Thieves

Baker City Sept 2—The chase of cattle thieves who got away with about twenty head of cattle from Sam Grover's ranch in Eagle Valley last Tuesday morning continues, with Sheriff Brown of Baker county and a posse of men still in close pursuit. Yesterday the four robbers had crossed over into Washington county, Idaho, and the sheriff of that county was endeavoring to locate them. Evidently the chase became too hot and the robbers again crossed to Oregon and this morning were reported to be in the vicinity of Durkee. A number of men were sent out to turn and head them off and it is thought that they cannot much longer escape. Deputy Sheriff Jess Snow left this morning for the scene of their reported appearance.

It is one of the liveliest chases that has been on in this part of the country for a long time and it is feared that the rustlers, should they be pressed too hard would not hesitate to shoot. For this reason all men joining the posse are heavily armed in anticipation of a pitched fight with the thieves when they are cornered.

It is believed that their capture is certain as the officers from both Idaho and Baker county are pressing them pretty close. They have struck the trail and are following it so hotly that it is impossible to lose the thieves in the end. The only fear being that the rustlers may abandon the cattle and take to the mountains which would make their capture very difficult and dangerous.
