This regulation is necessary to preserve the high standard in our school system, and teachers are instructed to enforce same rigidly, making no exceptions without consulting the experintendent.

RELAY RACE FOR LADY RIDERS Purse \$350. Ladies only.

CONDITIONS OF RELAY RACE

There must be three starters. Riders must go four miles each day, changing horses every mile. Race begins Tuesday afternoon. Best total time for 20 miles wins

First Money, \$200; \$100 for Second; \$50 for Third;

Entrys for this race required to give name of rider, names and description of the four horses they will ride, and file the same with the secretary. After the race starts no substitution of horses will be allowed except in case of accident, and then on the decision of the judges. Riders will be allowed two attendants for their mounts, and will each have a paddock to hold four horses, no assistance will be sllowed in mounting. Horses for relay race will be on the grounds before noon of Oct. 2, for inspection by judges. Use of track permited preceeding the week of fair at hours prescribed by track manager. No entrance fee.
