## Coal On Grande Ronde

There seems to be a good coal mine 12 miles from the mouth of the Grande Ronde river.

"We have driven a tunnel 185 feet into the coal vein," said Mr. Edwards, "and have lowered a shaft 30 feet at a point 135 feet from the mouth of the tunnel. From tests that have been made we are confident that the coal is of such a quality as to be desirable for steaming and blacksmithing purposes. It is of a lignite character, and crops out for a width of five miles adjacent to the Grande Ronde river."

## Acknowledges Guilt

Portland Sept 6—George Marshall, 19 years old, this morning pleaded guilty in State Circuit Court to attempting to extort money from Kasper Van Dran by writing him threatening letters after the mysterious death of his wife, telling him that the same fate awaited him unless money was forthcoming. He will be sentenced tomorrow. The penalty for the crime is imprisonment in the state penitentiary for a period of from six months to two years, or imprisonment in the county jail for a period of from three months to one year.

## To Raise Steamer

Wallula, Wash. Sept 6.—An effort will be made by the owners to raise the freight steamer Jerome, which was wrecked in west rapids, below the mouth of Snake river, Saturday afternoon. An examination of the boat yesterday revealed the fact that she is not so badly injured as first thought. A gasping hole in her bow is the only apparent injury, although it is possible that her bottom was punctured when she settled on the rocky river bed. The boat lies in about 10 feet of water. The deck is submerged, but the cabin and upper works are clear of water.

An experienced boatman will be employed in an effort to save the boat. The cargo of wheat stored in the hold will be fished out and an effort made to tow the steamer to shallow water so that repairs can be made.

## New Equipment

There has been ordered new, for the Harriman lines, 75 extra long, modern passenger coaches, costing \$10,000 each, and 5200 freight cars and 136 new locomotives. All must be delivered during 1906.

## Government Order

The Oregon Produce Company has a government contract for 1000 tons of timothy and 5000 sacks of oats. A large portion of the hay and nearly all of the oats will be supplied from this county.
