**HINT TO VOTERS**

Did it ever occur to you, when you deposit your ballot that you are acting as a trustee for a large number of people, who under our laws have no right to vote. In 1900 there were 83,128 260 people in the U S that were bound to obey such laws as the voters enacted. There were but 18,915 697 men with the right of franchise in the United States, and therefore only that number that had any power in law making. Taking the whole population that is subject to the laws you as a voter help make, 64,207 883 have or had in 1900, no more voice in the making thereof, than have the serfs of Russia or the peasants of China. It is presumable that you do consider the rights and interests of the 32,607,481 white women and girls and of the 15,283 138 white boys, but in view of many of our laws concerning women the presumption is a violent one. But while you are legislator for and make laws that 8,833,994 negroes are bound to obey, and for the 8,083,683 people in our insular possessions you should bear in mind that though they belong to other races they are entitled to be dealt with honestly and liberally. Every American voter owes it to his own self respect, as well as to the well being of his country that he so inform himself that he can vote intelligently on all questions that the law making and administration of the affairs of this big nation cast upon him and vote for the best interest of all concerned. The men who hold the elective franchise in the United States are a privileged class, numerically less than one quarter of the whole population. Their high privilege is to make the laws that the nonprivileged three fourths of the people must obey, with this privilege comes great responsibility which the voter should not shirk, and the task of gathering facts which he should not neglect.

**WANT AMENDMENTS**

Eight amendments to the Oregon State Constitution will probably be submitted for enactment under the Initiative and Referendum law at the election next June. They are:  
1st. Giving the people power to call a referendum on a single item in an appropriation bill of the legislature without affecting other items.  
2nd. Giving the people power to demand resignation of a delinquent officer, or remove him at special election.  
3rd. Giving cities power to make and amend their charters.  
4th. Giving minority parties representation in state legislative and city councils, in proportion to their voting members.  
5th. Allowing the duties and salary of state printers to be regulated by law.  
6th. Giving people exclusive power to create state institutions at other places than state capital.  
7th. Giving one legislature power to

prepare amendment to state constitution. It now requires two successive legislatures to prepare an amendment before a vote can be taken on it by the people.

8th. Prohibiting use of passes by public officers.

An organization is now being organized to urge these amendments headed by W S U'Ren of Oregon City.
