J L Caviness, one of the heavy stockholders and superintendant of construction of the Mountain Shrep Ditch company, has returned from Wallows and was to the city today on business.

The Mountain Sheep Ditch company is an immense project intended to water a large part of the Wallows vailey in the vicinity of Joseph Water is taken from the big and little Sheep creeks one mile south and six miles east of Joseph. Over a circuit ous route of about eight miles, the ditch which is 16 feet wide on the top and 12 feet on the bottom and four feet deep, winds out of the deep can yon to the level land below. In the course of the ditch two falls, one of 110 feet and the other of 121 feet are made. The amount of electrical power that may be generated by theae two falls is almost incalcuable, and sone time in the near future they will be developed and put to us .
