One kind of cement called hydraul c cement because it hardone under water | town. is composed of 20 or 30 per cent of clay, or finely pulverized silios, quartz or flint, and from 70 to 80 per cent of

Puzzolana, used in Italy and elsewhere is mainly composed of silicates of slumins, lime and sods.

Portland coment is made from elsy found in the valley of Medway, a tributary of the Thames in England, and chair, mixed together and burned.

Roman cement is similar to Portland, has more clay and solidifies more rapidly. All these cements hardon under water.

Chalk is a variety of lime stone or arbonate of lime. It is generally of a yellowish white color, but sometimes snow white, and generally contains some silica, alumina or magnesia, sometimes a'l of these, Silica occurs in nature as sand, flint, rock crystal and quartz.

The Eckerdorf of Bilesis, in Prossis, elebrated its one hundredth annivereary this year. This is the first and oldest sugar beet factory in the world During the first years of its history this lactory had a struggle for existnce, sometimes ranning and sometimes its doors were closed, but since 1829 is has operated continuously. From the beginning the sagar beet industry has grown until it is now ranked as one of the greatest industries of man and bids fair to be even the greatest.

The consumption of sugar in the United States increased nearly a hundred per cent from 1871 to 1903. The per capita consumption of sugar in the United States being 36 2 poudds in 1871, and 71 1 pounds in 1003. At the rate sugar was consumed in 1903, it will take six billions of pounds of sug r to supply our people this year.
