The Union Pacific needs 300 greeling otor ears of the type just finished, cording to the statement of W. S. McKeen, superintendent of motive power and machinery. At the rate of 50 a year, he says, the read cannot be supplied with the cars as rapidly as it will require them.

The present facilities for making them are being tested to the limit, but they are far from adequate. Additions to the shops are to be built at once, at a cost of \$700,000, which will increase the facilities. Representatives of other roads and of suburban lines who have sought to place orders for cars with the Union Pacific have been told they cannot be supplied.

Corn is nearly ripe and it is a good crop. Potatoes are generally free from blight and the prospects for a good yield of potatoes is much better than it was before the rains set in.
