NOVEL CASE AGAINST JUDGE CLIFFORD

However It is not Probable that Suit can be Sustained

Baker City, Sept. 21—What promises to be one of the most sensational suits ever filed in Grant county or this part of Oregon were begun yesterday when the papers were filed with the county clerk of Grant county by G. H. Guttridge against Attorney M. D. Clifford and Grant Thornburg for \$25,000 damages, which Guttridge alleges to have sustained on account of false imprisonment. It seems that the original trouble arose when Judge Clifford was circuit judge in Grant county. A suit was brought by Thornburg against his brother in law Guttridge for the recovery of certain money which he alleged to be due him by Guttridge.

Guttridge had homesteaded certain land in the vicinity of Olive Lake and had obtained the money to patent the claims from Thornburg. Later the property was purchased by the Red Boy mining company and the money paid over to Guttridge. Guttridge at once placed the money in his wife's name, so that when Thornburg attempted to get what he thought was due him, he was unable to do so. He was unable to do so. He brought suit in the circuit court for the money and was awarded judgment by Judge

Clifford. Guttridge appealed the case to the supreme court, and that court reversed the decision of the lower court, saying that if Guttridge did not have the money he did not have to pay it. While the case was on trial in the circuit court Guttridge was subpoenaed to appear. He failed to come when served with the necessary papers and was arrested for contempt of court. For this offense he was imprisoned for a number of months.

Now that the supreme court has given the decision in the case he believes that his imprisonment was false and unjust and seeks to recover damages in the amount of \$25,000, from Judge Clifford and Thornburg.

This morning Judge Clifford was served with the papers giving him notice of the suit, and Thornburg was also served with a like copy.

In speaking of the case, Judge Clifford was not inclined to look very seriously on the matter, as he said there were absolutely no grounds for the suit and he was confident that nothing could be done in the matter. He said, "They have no right to bring suit against me in this case as a circuit judge cannot be sued on a charge of this nature."
