## LAUNDRY BUSINESS OF LA GRANDE

Since the purchase of the Union Steam Laundry by the A. B. C. Steam Laundry, the latter's working force has been increased to 35 people, making it one of the largest industries of the kind in this section of the state. One would hardly imagine that the payroll aggregates \$290 a week for the seven men and 28 girls and women who are employed there, but it does.

Over 300 family washings consisting of an average of four dozen pieces, all of the hotel work and numberless package jobs are cared for by this institution weekly. The number of pieces of laundry per day or per week sent forth is almost beyond the comprehension of the average person, as no count has been made by the proprietors and even they cannot make an estimate.

From as far as Palmer, Idaho, and into the Wallawa county and every immediate station comes daily huge

crates of soiled laundry which is sent back spotless within a few hours.

In buying the Union Steam Laundry the additional machinery necessitated the building of an office and new sorting room on the north side of the building. With the machinery the firm took the male employees and many of the female employees of the laundry greatly augmented the force and capacity. New machinery is on the road between here and Chicago. This machinery is new to this section of the country being special apparatus to iron ladies' garments.

Notwithstanding the fact that there is but the one laundry in the city the prices remain the same as the old times and which, when compared with city prices, are found to be lower, although it would be naturally supposed that the equipment of the city laundry would allow the managers to do work at lower prices than a smaller institution.
