Grande Ronde Electric Company May Extend Line

State Senator Walter M. Pierce, one of the principal stockholders of the Grande Ronde Valley Electric Co., was in Elgin the first of the week looking over Elgin with a view of extending the line to this city and furnishing lights and power.

In conversation with some of our citizens Mr. Pierce stated that everything looked favorable for an extension and that no doubt his company would be doing business in Elgin in the very near future.

Rumor has it that this company has secured or will secure the electric light franchise recently granted to H. D. Spencer, et al, and that a steam plant will be installed until the line can be extended down the valley to Elgin. When the new line is extended Elgin will have plenty of electricity for both light and power purposes—Recorder.
