UNITAH LANDS SAID TO BE WORTHLESS

Earl J. Sheets, who is one of the reputed lucky persons in the Unitah land drawing in Baker City, says that the thing was practically a hoax as the land was worthless. Mr. Sheets drew number 258 which in the ordinary land lottery would at least be worth the selection but in this case he says the land was not worth filing as he did not file. He was not the only man who refused to file. His choice by lot was the 258th, but so many men dropped out of the line by refusing to file that Mr. Sheets was offered 185th choice and still he refused to take the land as a gift.

"Nearly all of the land thrown open to settlement," said Mr. Sheets, "is absolutely worthless. I wouldn't have it as a gift. The Indians, of course, were given all of the best land, but the people did not know this as the real estate boomers who wanted to

make money out of a big lottery, advertised that the land was a veritable Garden of Eden. The government attempted to counteract the effects of this wild catting but were unable to do so and hundreds of suckers hooked to the reservation. When they drew their numbers and were allowed to go in and look over the land they left in disgust.

"I had my choice of all the land covered between Nos. 188 and 258, but I didn't want it as I can get better land right here in Oregon any day without paying out any fee to those land sharks. But the sharks reaped a rich harvest. They got \$25 for pointing out what they called choice claims and then \$10 for locating the corners of the claim, and all kinds of other little fees. In my opinion the people who filed upon this land will leave it within a few years for it is about worthless."—Baker City Herald.

W. C. T. U. CONVENTION

The delegates and representatives of the Women's Christian Temperance Union of Union county met for their annual session on Sept. 30 and 31 in Union.

Lunch was served as on the previous day and the business of the convention wound up in good shape. As one remarked, it had been a strong convention since in union there is strength, and those from abroad fully sympathized with what the entertaining union saw fit to suggest and really we all felt the meetings were helpful, special mention being made of the parliamentary drills and discouraging of school saving banks. On the last evening three of the old girls came on with recitations and our brothers also loaned a helping hand by tilting largely the need of work on the line of narcotics.
