FAIR NEXT WEEK

More interest is being taken in the Grande Ronde County Fair Association as the time for it draws near. The special feature of the race meet will be the great relay race for women. Already three entries have been made, but many more are expected before the opening day as the purse of \$300 is to be divided among the three winners. Two hundred dollars goes to the first, \$100 to the second and \$50 to the third. The conditions are that four miles shall be run each day. Each lady rider shall have four horses. When the first mile is run she is to dismount, and mount a fresh horse unassisted, and proceed. This race will be continued five days until the 20 miles shall have been run.

At present there are 15 horses on the track in training and by Monday three cars of horses from the Walla Walla race will be on hand for the opening day. Other horses that are scattered over the different circuits will also be here, until there will be the largest string of horses on the track that has ever been.

Special care has been taken in preparing the purses and races, and sports lovers can be assured that the meet will be a good one. While the Portland fair has occupied the attention of the public to a great extent the management has labored to make this week, Oct 3 to the 9, inclusive, an attractive one.
