County Court Petition

To the Hon County Judge, County Clerk and County Assessor of Union County, Oregon, sitting as a board of equalization on the assessment of real and personal property in said Union County for the year 1935:

Your petitioners on behalf of themselves and other tax payers of Union County, Oregon, represent and show that for the year 1935 the County Assessor has assessed the real and personal property of the tax payers of Union County at a speculative value instead of an actual cash value provided by law.

The total assessment for Union County of more than \$12,000,000.00 is greatly in excess of the assessments made by other county assessors in their respective counties.

That the present assessment in this county is a raise of 300 per cent over the assessment of 1934, which is far greater than the raise in any other county in the state.

Your petitioners represent and show that the total assessment for the current year for the other counties in the state remains practically the same as for 1934, viz: Baker County approximately 4,000,000.00; Umatilla 9,000,000.00; Morrow 4,000,000.00; Grant 4,000,000.00.

Your petitioners represent and show that the money mainaining the state is now apportioned among the several counties of the state in accordance with the table adopted by the Legislature of 1933.

That according to the table there are twelve counties paying more state tax than Union County.

That the amount of the State tax now being paid by Union County is approximately \$23,000.00 annually.

That upon a readjustment of this table by subsequent legislature, Union County under its present assessment would be compelled to pay for many years to come an undue proportion of the state taxes at \$60,000.00 annually by reason of its becoming under the present erroneous assessment, the second heaviest tax paying county in the state, instead of the twelfth as it is at present.

Wherefore your petitioners most earnestly request and pray that you sitting at the Board of Equalization reduce one half of all assessments, both real and personal returned by the assessor for the current year for Union County, and your petitioners will ever pray.
