IMMIGRATION FRIGHT

During the month of September last 90,772 immigrants landed at New York City, the largest number that ever reached our shore in that month, being a daily average of 3,025 and 8,064 more than arrived in Sept. 1904. If this rate should be kept up for the year more than one million of people will come to the United States. The bulk of these new comers are laborers and what effect such a vast number of wage earners will have on the labor market may justly cause serious consideration.

Yet in view of the past history of our country the condition is not so threatening as upon first appearance. The U. S. is a growing country and its principal requirement is more people—labor, to, not only carry on the present business of the country, but to increase it and develop the unused resources of the country that have lain dormant since creation for over five thousand years.

In 1900 there were 10,460,085 persons of foreign birth in the United States; exclusive of Alaska, Hawaii, Indian Territory, and Indian reservations. This is a gain in the number of foreign born of 3,780,142 in twenty years, or a yearly increase of 189,007 on an average.

The tide of immigration is deepening in 1905 it brought 150,237 persons of all ages and sexes to this country. During the first two years of the civil war immigration fell to 89,365 a year. In 1903 it reached 857,046 and this year it bids fair to bring one million people to our shores.

The coming of this vast multitude should not alarm us or disturb business of any kind, for besides the fifty million dollars the immigrants annually bring with them they fetch their wants to be supplied by our local market. To feed and cloth this million of new comers each year, assuming that they consume at the same rate the total population did in 1903, will require 5,810,000 bushels of wheat, 30,045,000 bushels of corn, 71,100,000 pounds of sugar, 21,640,000 pounds of raw cotton, 5,740,000 pounds of wool, 10,790,000 pounds of coffee and 1,300,000 pounds of tea, besides the numerous necessary articles not mentioned here.

The home market that the immigrants strengthen is far more valuable to the people at large than the foreign one. In 1903 we exported in wheat and flour but 30.28 per cent of the wheat grown.
