PUBLIC SCHOOL MONTHLY REPORT

The school board met last night with Directors Young, Kilpatrick, Ivanhoe and Bay, Superintendent J M Martin and Clerk A C Williams present. The minutes were read and the superintendent's report for the past month was read and placed on file. The teachers' and janitor's salaries were allowed and a number of smaller bills audited and warrants ordered drawn for their payment. The diplomas of Thomas L. Williams, Alice McKinley and Grace Swan were approved and the holders authorized to teach in the school. A number of minor changes and repairs were ordered. A dictionary and a number of umbrella stands were ordered and the blackboards ordered changed in the White school building.

The superintendent's report was as follows:

Enrollment, boys, 303; girls, 438; total 831. Number of days taught, 19; number of times tardy, 49; average daily attendance, 696; number of visits by directors, 4; number of visits not by directors, 22; number of cases of corporal punishment 22.

The enrollment for this year is 831 over 780 for the same month last year. Times tardy this month, 49; last year same month, 73.
