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EARNST GOOD HUMOR

The grand juries have laid aside the traditional whitewash brush to use on the crimes of the rich and great, but with a manly vigor scrutinize the acts of those in high places that is astonishing to the class of men who have recently been indicted as law breakers. Petty juries responsive to the national impulse and earnest demand for "a square deal" are convicting a class of law breakers that have heretofore been considered immune from the penalties of their crimes. The people with an earnestness, incomprehensible to the grafters and manipulators of crafty schemes to gain illegal wealth, are showing to

the world that a free people has the nerve and virtue to enforce their own laws. This attitude of the American people has silenced for all time the croaking of despotism and aristocracy, "that the people have neither the capacity nor virtue for self government."
