The Presbytery of Grande Ronde met last night according to appointment, at the Presbyterian church of this city, and was opened with prayer by the retiring Moderator, the Rev E B Hays.

Previous to the organization at the devotional service, Rev H A Ketchum D D of Baker City, read the Scripture, and the Rev H Templeton of Enterprise offered prayer. Rev S A Parker of Elgin delivered an interesting sermon on the subject "God's Power Available," showing that things which might seem impossible from a human standpoint are yet available through divine co-operation. This sermon should have been delivered by the Moderator, but the meeting being in his own church, by act of courtesy the Rev Mr Parker consented to take his place.
