Bankers Quit

Scraps News Association.

Washington, Oct 13—The bankers closed their sessions today. Harvey D Gonder of Cleveland, a marine lawyer spoke in advocacy, the ship subsided.

The scheme proposed by C F Ellis, of Era, Pa, to insure deposits of the National banks caused considerable discussion. The Ellis plan was for each National bank in the United States to contribute annually the sum of one hundred dollars to be placed in the care of the Comptroller of Currency for the purpose of safeguarding the deposits. Ellis declared that this would raise the public confidence, and he further says that had this been done for the last five years the fund would have paid the depositors of every bank that has failed and would have left two million dollars in the fund.

A resolution was adopted denying the report that the association had offered Carl Becker "the King of forgers" the sum of twelve thousand dollars a year to refrain from plying his profession, after his release from San Quentin prison. John J Hampton of Hoopston, Ill, was elected President of the association.
