AMERICAN SHIPS

One of the unsolved problems which the United States of America now presents for the consideration of the American people is "Why a people, the descendants from sea roving ancestors, should fail to keep step with the age and to really sailing behind as ocean carriers?" The fact is that we are less a sea going people than we were one hundred years ago. In 1800 with 5,304,483 people we had American built ships with a tonnage of 669,921 tons employed in our foreign trade, and in 1903 there were 893,776 tonnage of American built ships engaged in our foreign trade, showing that, while our population that year was 80,372,000 or fifteen times greater than it was in 1800, our ships engaged in our foreign trade had but one and one third more tonnage in 1903 than in 1800.

To further illustrate the relative decline of our merchant marine engaged in our foreign trade we will quote from an official report which gives the imports and exports of the U S for 1800 thus: Exports of merchandise at \$70,971,780 a per capita of \$13.37, and our imports of merchandise at \$1,252,768 a per capita of \$17.19. By adding the exports and imports for 1800 we find our foreign trade that year aggregated \$1,622,548. In 1903 we imported merchandise to the value of \$1,025,719,237, a per capita of imports of \$12.54 and the same year we exported \$1,420,141,679 worth of merchandise, a per capita of exports of \$17.32. By adding the exports and imports of 1903 we find that our foreign trade for that year aggregated \$2,445,860,916. These figures show that our foreign trade like that of our population increased fifteen fold from 1800 to 1903, while our merchant marine only enlarged one and one third times.

In 1800 the exported agricultural products of the United States were valued at \$25,590,534 a per capita of farm exports of \$1.82. In 1903 the farms in the United States produced for export \$873,322,882 worth of produce, a per capita to all the people in the United States of \$10.86. From these figures it will be seen that the farms produced for export thirty four and nine tenths more in 1903 than in 1800 during which period of 103 years our merchant marine only increased one and one third times.

In 1800 all the factories in the United States exported products valued at \$2,493,755 a per capita of not quite forty seven cents. The products of the American factories exported in 1903 were valued at \$407,526,59 a growth of 164.4 fold over the exports of 1800. In 1903 the imports into this

country by sea were valued at \$959,511,045 of this \$123,666,832 worth, or 12.9 per cent came in American ships and \$835,844,210 worth in foreign ships our exports by sea in American ships in 1903 were valued at \$91,028,200 and that in foreign ships at \$1,100,262,378 being 92.9 per cent of our exports by sea.
