## TWO MORE LAND FRAUDERS GUILTY

### Ira Wade Acquitted. No More Trials Until About Nov. 1.

The Federal jury was out only thirty minutes in bringing in a verdict of guilty against two of the defendants, Willard N Jones and Thaddeus S Potter, and not guilty against Ira Wade.

This makes the fourth conviction in connection with the Oregon land fraud. The trial of Jones, Potter and Wade began two weeks ago. They were indicted on a charge of conspiracy to defraud the Government. The evidence produced by the Government at the trial showed that Jones had conceived the idea of buying old soldiers' claims on homesteads in the Benewah Indian reservation. He, through Wells, also an old soldier, secured the old soldiers, located them on the claims, built them cabins, loaned them money and took mortgages upon their claims. It was upon the evidence of these veterans these veterans that

the conviction was obtained. Willard Jones was a civil engineer and timber locator. Thaddeus Potter is an attorney, and Ira Wade clerk of Lincoln county.

District Attorney Heney, whose tireless efforts brought about the conviction of the two men, will leave today for Tucson, Arizona, where he is to argue a case on the 20th. From there he will return to San Francisco, settle up some personal matters that need his attention, and then he will go to Washington D C to appear before the Supreme Court in the Benewah case. Judge Hunt, who was brought from Montana to try the Williamson-Gesner-Biggs case, will leave on Monday for Butte. This will be the last of the land fraud cases until Mr Heney returns, which he expects will be about November 1.

## SYNOD MEETING CLOSURES SATURDAY

### Will Probably Meet at Seaside Next Year

The closing services of the Synod were held in the religious meetings of yesterday. At 8:30 a m Synod met to observe The quiet Hour of Worship led by the Moderator. At 10 the Sunday School was addressed by Revs. A J Montgomery, and L M Hooser and Miss Julia Hatch. At 11 Rev H. N Mount delivered an excellent sermon. At 3 p m The Lord's Supper was observed. Rev Geo Gillispie led the minds of Synod in an appropriate address.

The Young Peoples' Rally at 6 p m was well attended and a profitable address was given by Rev M I Sharp. The closing hour was given to Home Missions and a consecration service addressed and led by Rev Edgar P Hill D D pastor of the First Presbyterian Church Portland. Dr Hill spoke of the work of the Church for our own people The foreigners coming out and the laboring people Dr Hill is the National delegate of the

Portland Ministerial Union to the Labor Unions and sits with them regularly as a welcome guest.

The church was full of interested listeners and appreciated the splendid address to which they listened. Then the members of the Synod gathered about the speaker and in song and prayer covenanted together for a promise prosperity for the year ahead.

During the evening the men's chorus sang selections fitted to the occasion.

The meeting of Synod has been most successful. Pastor Hayes of the La Grande Church, ably seconded by the members made all possible arrangements for the dispatch of the work. Rev W L Van Nuy made an excellent presiding officer. The members of Synod were up to their work and the entire meeting passed off in fine shape. La Grande cannot have two gatherings of such gentlemen, they do good to any community, which they visit.
