THOUSANDS ARE COMING WEST

A. L. Craig Gives the Fair Much Credit For It

A. L. Craig, general passenger agent of the O. R. & N., believes that the Lewis and Clark exposition will be the means of drawing many settlers to Oregon from all parts of the east. He declares that over 10,000 homeseekers are arriving daily in his state over the O. R. & N. and Southern Pacific lines.

All the trans-continental roads began selling the colonists tickets September 15, and will continue the low rates until October 31. The rate is \$33 from Chicago, \$10 from St. Louis and \$25 from St. Paul. The number of tickets sold by all roads is in excess of the number sold while the colonists rates were in force last year or during the spring months this year. A small

proportion of those coming are visitors who expect to return, as the bulk of such people took advantage of the cheap rates to the exposition. Some of these who came are locating in the cities but the majority are farmers who will buy land in all sections of the state.

This increased travel is looked upon as the direct result of the fair. Many of those who are coming attended the exposition early in the season and returned to sell their property in the east before locating here permanently. Others are being drawn to Oregon by the favorable reports given out by those who have returned east after visiting the Pacific coast.

A SHOW WITH MOONSHINE STILL

New York, Oct. 17—The convention of the National Dealers association which opened today in Madison Square Garden is the largest in point of attendance ever held by the organization. Numerous important matters principally of legislation, are on the schedule for consideration and decision. Among other things to receive attention is the so-called Webber prohibition bill for the District of Columbia. This bill was introduced in Congress at the last session, and provides for absolute prohibition throughout the District of Columbia. Representative Webber of Ohio, who framed the measure, claims that he has enough votes to insure its passage at the coming session. The liquor dealers will present vigorous opposition to prevent its enactment.

In conjunction with the present convention there is being held a Wine and Spirits Industrial Show, the first of its kind here. The exhibition illustrates every phase of the manufacture and marketing of wines, spirituous liquors, and carbonated beverages. Among the features is genuine Kentucky moonshine still in operation.

"Uncle Josh Perkins"

Uncle Josh Perkins assisted by his hired man, Hiram Green successfully entertained a large audience last evening at Steward's Opera house. Uncle Josh, although an old character, did not fail to amuse, while the antics of awkward Hiram were sidesplitting. His appearance at the supper table was almost a whole show to itself. Counterfeit Reissued

Chief Wilkie of the United States secret service has announced that the counterfeit of the \$10 United States note first discovered in July 1903 has been reissued with a marked improvement in the color and form of the figures in the treasury numbers. They more nearly approximate the genuine. There has been a slight improvement in the color of the black, which is not so dark as the first issue.

Ambassador Coming

Berlin, Oct. 17—The Baron Speck von Sternburg, German Ambassador to the United States, who has been home on a vacation, sailed from Bremen today for New York. The baroness, who recently underwent an operation, will follow the baron to Washington next month.
