PICKING CANDIDATES

In the coming elections, state, county and city, for the ensuing terms, there is apt to be some rather close discrimination in the selection of candidates by the people at large in this state. Heretofore but little attention has been given to the record of a candidate coming up for election, except of course, the usual mud slinging by his opponents. Often the recommendation that a candidate had successfully conducted his business was sufficient to gain the confidence of the voter but this time it will be looked into that he has not used government, state, or county property to gain the reputation of being a good business man.

Reform is the order of the day. Whether it be in national or municipal, reform is the one great topic. Headed by that powerful reformer, Theodore Roosevelt, and going down to the hardly lesser lights such as Jerome, of New York; Folk, of Missouri; Hoch, of Kansas; Weaver, of Philadelphia; Heney, now at work at Portland and a score who have had the encouragement of the chief executive of the United States to urge them on for clean government. This year when the direct nomination goes into effect the people will be given the power to say whether a man with a clean record goes in for the race or one whose record is somewhat smirched.

YELLOW FEVER

The fact that President Roosevelt is now enroute to New Orleans adds interest to the yellow fever situation there. On Sunday the 15th there were 9 new cases and 3 deaths. The number of cases up to 6 p m Oct 15 totaled 3,314, of these 431 died, 2,740 discharged as cured leaving 143 in hospitals under treatment. The death rate of those having the disease was 13 per cent. The per cent of patients discharged was a little over 82.67 per cent of those sent to hospitals with yellow fever 4.33 per cent stricken were yet in hospitals, while the head lines to the yellow fever news have all along announced that the disease was under control the figures do not substantiate the hope.

Boise City and Pendleton are both confronted with the fact that the saloons are driving business houses away from the principle streets owing to the fact that saloons pay higher rents. For a number of years the council of La Grande refused to permit a saloon on Adams avenue and at present there are only two. There should be none on this street, and if we are to profit by our neighboring cities, this street will be protected.

One of the department stores in Chicago has installed a complete creamery plant.

According to a Portland paper Judge S A Lowell and ex-Governor T T Geer will be aspirants for the United States senate next spring.

An increase for the first six months of 1905 of more than 3500 babies in New York over last year's total of 47,384, showing a birth rate of 28 for every 1000 of population, should quiet race suicide alarms.
