To Colonize Canada

Salvation Army to send 20,000 families from London

It is proposed by the Salvation Army to move some 20,000 families from London to Canada for colonization upon the lands of that country. None but strong men will be chosen, for hard work will be required to conquer the problems to be faced. Singularly enough an outcry has been raised against the program it being claimed it will be detrimental to the country to have so many able-bodied men taken away. That is a narrow view for anybody to take of such work. Ever one will realize that the families, once established upon the soil, will be far better off than they ever could be in the great metropolis, where tens of thousands of people suffering from hunger can always be found. If the economists who object to the emigration could furnish work for all who may go the latter would still be gainers from going.

Campaign On

Bert Huffman, editor of the East Oregonian has formally announced his candidacy for the mayoralty, in opposition to Mayor W F Matlock. Hoff man will champion the cause of a closed town and says he has the support of all church people and many business men. Matlock represents the open town element.
