THE PRIMARY ELECTION

The primary election law, under which for the first time, the voters belonging to the several political parties in Oregon, will make nominations for their party to be voted for at the general election next June, is a new and untried plan. It may be justly styled a political evolution; if not revolution. It is an evolution because it radically overturns a practice that has been followed since the formation of parties in the U S more than one hundred years ago. It is an evolution because it marks the most advanced step that the mass of the people have taken toward realizing and putting into practical operation the theory of "a government by the people and for the people" since the Declaration of Independence, 129 years ago.

If the people will, by their action at the primary election, demonstrate that they can and will nominate fit and clean men to be voted for at the June election, by so doing they will banish from our political machinery the last remnant of feudalism that has controlled political parties in this state and educated the young voters into the narrow conception of politics and civil duties that the prime object and purpose of parties and partisanship is to secure a fat office for the big man of the party, and for him to divide the smaller offices among his favorites.

The result of bossism is that with a state constitution limiting state indebtedness to \$50,000 and county indebtedness to \$5,000 our state debt is more than ten times above the limit, and some of our counties more than twenty fold. Notwithstanding these enormous debts, the people have been annually taxed heavily. Now that the people have a chance to take state and county matters into their own hands, it is to be hoped they will realize their responsibility and act and take charge of state and county management. They certainly cannot do worse for themselves than the bosses have done for them.

The Boise council has passed an ordinance forbidding the use of cigarettes by any person under 21 years of age, and also the having of cigarette "makings" in the possession of any minor.

While the Scout is not going to resort to what is familiarly called "knocking" neither will it give further notoriety to irresponsible speculators or their non-productive enterprises. We will thank all persons with unreliable plans for developing the Northwest to peddle their ideas elsewhere for cheap adver-

tising. It will be an act of charity to the reading public to draw the mantle of oblivion around fake developments.—Union Scout.
