FOR FIVE YEARS

At the last term of circuit court the county officials compiled a comparative statement of the expenditures of Union County for the years of 1902, 1903, 1904 and 1905. The figures indicate that the expenses for the year ending October 1st are the largest of the four years but this may be explained by the expense of moving the court records. For the year of 1904 the expenses were less than any preceding year except for 1903 when they totaled \$51,537.72.

Comparative statement of the County of Union, State of Oregon from October 1st, 1902 to October 1st 1905.

The expense of the county from Oct 1st, 1902 to March 31st, 1903, was \$23,294.05 and from April 1st, 1903, to Oct 1st, 1903, it was, \$28,241.12 making a total expense for that year of \$51,537.72. There were outstanding warrants drawn on the General Fund, on March 31st, 1903, the sum of \$224,964.95.

The expense of the county from Oct 1st, 1903, to March 31st, 1904, was \$27,201.20 and from March 31st, 1904 to October 1st, 1904 it was \$26,844.69, making a total expense for that year of \$54,047.89. There were outstanding warrants drawn on the General Fund, on March 31st, 1904, the sum of \$224,964.95.

The expense of the county from October 1st, 1904 to March 31st, 1905, was \$26,424.92 and from March 31st, 1905, it was \$25,964.67, making a total expense for that year of \$52,389.49. There were outstanding warrants on the General Fund, on October 1st, 1905, the sum of \$160,902.37.

Subtracting from the outstanding face value of warrants on March 31st, 1905, \$224,964.78. The amount outstanding on Oct. 1st, 1905, \$160,902.37 shows a decrease face value of, \$63,902.41.

Too much praise cannot be given to Mrs Laugbilla in her impersonation of Esther, the beautiful queen. In addition to her perfect fitness for the part in voice and physique, she has given a most careful and conscientious study to the part. Mr George L Claver, who has a deep, rich baritone voice, sings the part of King Ahasuerus with wonderful effect. Mr C P Ferris will appear as Mordecai, the Jew, as he possesses in addition to a splendid lyric tenor voice much dramatic ability.

Mr Tom Williams and Mrs Carr as Haman and Zerah, have possibly the most difficult parts to portray, but they will undoubtedly acquit themselves with great credit. Mr Williams has a very pleasing tenor voice, and Mrs Carr possesses a sympathetic contralto voice of great richness, and their conception of their parts could hardly be improved upon. One of the most pleasing numbers is the solo by Mrs Dr Richardson in her character of Prophetess, which she sings in most excellent taste, and with great effect. The numbers by Mrs Jay Van Buren as Mordecai's sister are deserving of special mention. Her sweet, high soprano voice is well suited to the part she sings, and will contribute wonderfully to the pleasure of the occasion.

Space will not permit of extended notices, but favorab's mention should be made of the work of Mrs Forrest and Miss Aldrich as the princesses, Mr Davis as the scribe, Mr Hendricks as Hegai and Sherwood Williams as the king's guard.
