A wooden frame corresponding to the Edward Gunderson to Charles size of the tank should then be set in Anderson NEW NWW part of NWW the excavation after the bottom has Tp 4 SR 38, or been pre ared and the cement poured around toe outside and allowed to harden, leaving the walls from six to eight inches thick. If the tank is for s small number of persons I would soggest that a partition extend across the inside of the bottom of the tank, 22 inches high and four inches thick. The wooden fram s should be removed as soon as the cement is bard enough to permit. The top may be covered Newlin Drag Co. with an arched roof cement with a manhole, or with planking, and if the tank is of sufficient size it may have simply a shingle roof. If the tank is large, say 30 feet long, I would sug gest that a battle board be placed eight set from the inlet, extending down crosswise to within two feet of the ottom. Eighteen feet from the injet I would recommend placing a weir or solid partition of cement, extending from the bottom of the tank to within is inches of the surface, and I would have another baffle board like the former six feet from the outlet. The pipe leading to the tank should be at least four inches in diameter, with an elbow and pipe extending 18 inches below the surface of the scum. The outlet should be three or four inches in diameter with an elbow extending 18 inches below the surface. One or nore intakes and outlets should be used, according to the size of the tank They should be on an exact level. The pipe leading to the tank should have ust enough fall to convey the sawage, avoiding as much as possible the dis-turbance of the tank,"—Oregonian.
