**GERMAN TARIFF**

The new German tariff which will go into effect March 1st, 1906, increases the tariff on imported wheat into that country from 22 cents 57 mills per bushel to 48 cents, 52 mills per bushel. There will also be a very considerable increase in the new German tariff on wheat flour and most of the articles exported from the United States to Germany. Germany has been a good customer to purchase wheat from our country, but of late she has not been purchasing very much of our wheat.

For the eight months ending with August 1905 we exported to Germany 6,945,728 bushels of wheat valued at \$5,441,041. For the same eight months in 1904 we sent to Germany 1,590,556 bushels of wheat valued at \$1,302,290 and in the eight months ending with August 1905 our exports of wheat to Germany amounted to but 88,000 bushels valued at \$74,600.

It will be remembered that the price of wheat in 1903 was a fraction over 78 cents per bushel and in 1904 it was but a small fraction over 80 cents a bushel and in 1905 the price of wheat for the same eight months was nearly 85 cents per bushel.

From the above figures it would seem that the cheaper our wheat is the more Germany purchases. The effect of a tariff that adds 25 cents, 8 1/2 mills to the cost of a bushel of wheat unloaded from the U S in Germany may be guessed at \$1.

**STATE PRINTER**

It is proposed by the committee having such matters in charge, of which W S U'Ren is the leader, to have the people vote at the election next June on a constitutional amendment abolishing the office of state printer. If the amendment carries, the state will hereafter get its printing done by contract.

From the first establishment of that office under A Bush there has been complaint about the cost of the state's printing, but whether any money would be saved to the state by the contract plan is problematical. Contractors are as much given to make all they can out of a job as officials.

**MUCH WHEAT SOLD**

Frank Kilpatrick estimates that fully 75 per cent of this year's wheat crop has been purchased by the various mills and wheat buyers of the county. This leaves but a small part in the hands of the grower. The prices for the past few days have advanced until forty-fold is commanding 66 cents a bushel and blue stem a close second at 65 cents. Club is being eagerly hoarded at 63 cents by the mills.

Little forty-fold is wanted by the mills, as early in the season the bins were well stocked up with this variety.

The crisis confronted by Russia at the present time is a situation seldom met with by a civilized country. It is true that many countries have been in the same situation many years ago but to believe that such a situation should exist in this day and age is almost incredible. History records that whenever a people caused a revolution in such a case they have been victorious. France for instance, overthrew the monarchy and in its stead stands a prosperous republic. Russia is confronted by the same conditions. Either a republic or a liberal form of government such as exists in England or Germany are the results that will follow the movement.
