SENATOR MAY RESIGN

Facts are Williamson and Herrman Should do Likewise

It is believed by some well-informed politicians that powerful influences are being brought to bear on United States Senator Mitchell to force him to resign his office and permit Governor Chamberlain to appoint a successor to serve until the next session of the legislature.

An even more interesting report is that Governor Chamberlain is considering the advisability of issuing an open letter to Senator Mitchell, giving reasons why he should resign and offering as a political concession that, if he will do so, he will bind himself to appoint a Republican to the senate.

These are but two of the many significant rumors that are flying around. The situation appears to warrant the assertion that important conferences have been held which partially have paved the way for the voluntary retirement of Senator Mitchell. The current reports do not so invariably include the congressmen, although by many they, too, are mentioned in the plan to procure a full delegation from Oregon to congress. As an instance of the manner in which some well informed persons are discussing the matter, one in particular said today: "I have been told that Senator Mitchell will resign within a few weeks and that probably his resignation will be in the hands of Governor Chamberlain before congress assembles."

"This report came to me from a source that compelled me to give it close attention and inquiry among my political acquaintances brings to light many facts that appear to corroborate it."

"Such a move as has been alleged to be under consideration by Governor Chamberlain—to appoint a Republican if Senator Mitchell will resign—would be a brilliant stroke on the part of the chief executive. It would greatly strengthen him throughout the entire state and start his campaign for reelection in the most favorable circumstances."

It is known that the pressure on Senator Mitchell and the two con-

gressmen to induce them to resign daily is becoming stronger. The needs of the state of Oregon this winter, with obstacles in the way of federal appropriations for the improvement of the Columbia river, are the principal elements in the situation.—Portland Journal.
