### Elections Tuesday

Elections will be held Tuesday, November 7, in seven states and six of the larger cities. In Massachusetts Rhode Island, Virginia and Ohio, a governor and other state officers are to be chosen, and in Pennsylvania, Maryland and Nebraska minor state officers, judges or regents of the State University in New York, Indianapolis, Louisville, Salt Lake and San Francisco a mayor and other city officers, and, in Chicago, Sanitary trustees and judges are to be voted for.

The Democrats and Populists fused in Nebraska, the Republicans and Democrats against the Union Labor party in San Francisco and the Republicans and other parties against the Democrats in Louisville.

In Pennsylvania there has been a miscellaneous indorsement of the Republican and Democratic candidates.

The Prohibitionists have a ticket in Massachusetts, Rhode Island, Pennsylvania, Maryland, Ohio, Nebraska, New York, Indianapolis and Chicago; the Socialists in Massachusetts, Rhode Island, Pennsylvania, Ohio, Nebraska, Virginia, New York and Chicago; the Socialist Labor party in Massachusetts Rhode Island, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Virginia, New York and Indianapolis; the Municipal Ownership party in New York and the American parties in Salt Lake.

There are six candidates for mayor in New York, and four in Indianapolis.
