**CHANCE OSTEO-

Commencing at the south east corner of the intersection of Spruce Street with Adams Avenue; thence along and upon the south side of Adams Avenue, in a south easterly direction, to the south west corner of the intersection of Adams Avenue with Balm Street by placing thereon a six (6) foot sidewalk according to the specifications of the ordinance providing such improvement.
