## TRAVELS ENDED FOR GLOBE TROTTER

Gustave Laurent the French globe trotter, who visited La Grande for about three days about the first of Oct. was shot and killed by masked highwaymen while riding in a freight car on the Southern Pacific near Red Bluff, California. Laurent and his companion Louis Avenel, another pedestrian Frenchman who was in La Grande about the first of September were on their way to San Francisco from Portland. They were riding in a box car when two masked men suddenly appeared and commanded them to turn over their money. The

globe trotters were frightened and Laurent attempted to escape and was shot and instantly killed. Avenel remained with the dead body until the two robbers knew the Frenchmen were in the car and believed that they had considerable money as they were generally given sums by the citizens of the towns through which they passed. Avenel is from Montreal and Laurent came from Paris. They were both on a tour around the world on foot.

## MAKES SEVERE CHARGES

In answer to the Observer reporter's usual "Anything doing this morning?" Chief of Police Rayburn answered "Something would certainly have been doing if a couple of strangers had not played the man's part and informed me of what was taking place at just about the right time. Yesterday evening a little thirteen year old girl arrived in this city from Joseph Penleton to the Catholic school at Pendleton, in company which would have made her mother shudder at her father don his war paint had they known the danger which was in store for her." The company referred to by the chief was a traveling man by the name of Parrott, who according to the story told by the two men who were passengers, and confirmed by the little girl's own statement, is certainly a brute of the most degraded type. The child's statement is that Parrott and the little girl were passengers on the stage from Joseph, and when they arrived at the hill the other passengers got out to walk, but Parrott and the girl remained, and his actions were such that his jastardly intentions were unmistakable and she becoming frightened jumped out and sought safety with the other passengers. When they arrived at Elgin Parrott was again on hand and secured a seat beside her. Here his actions were such as to attract the attentions of the two gentlemen who plainly saw him place his hands beneath the little one's dresses and in other ways conduct himself as to demonstrate that he was, to use the language of the chief, "not fit for the society of hogs, not to mention that of young girls." Upon arriving here Parrott went to the Foley hotel where he secured a room for the child, explaining that he would see that she was put upon the train this morning for Pendleton. Chief of Police Rayburn and Deputy Sheriff Frank Phy took the girl in charge and her questioned she confirmed all

that has been said by the two men who came up on the Elgin train. The little one was placed on the train this morning by the chief and she will no doubt soon be with the Sisters where she will be protected from further harm. Parrott denies having made any ungentlemanly advances and states that he was simply assisting the little girl on her way to her destination.
