Lewiston Young Men Arrested For Murder

Lewiston, Mont., Nov. 9.—Private detectives aided by local officers, have arrested and lodged in the county jail, Edward Taylor and Ray Long, two well known young men, and Albert Heinke, a printer employed on a Lewistown paper, on the charge of murdering Samuel Studzinski, an aged pawnbroker, on the night of August 28, and robbing him of \$2000 in gold. Because of the good standing of Taylor and Long their arrest has caused a sensation. Studzinski was choked and beaten to death and his trunk was rid of money and other valuables. He has a brother in San Francisco, said to be a wealthy jeweler and who has spared no expense to ferret out the crime.
