Company Pays

Pendleton, Nov. 17.—Seventy-eight thousand, five hundred and thirty-three dollars and eighteen cents were paid over to Sheriff Taylor this morning by the O. R. & N. Company in settlement of their back taxes as per the agreement reached last Saturday between the county court and representatives of the company. The above payment was made by Colonel J. H. Raley, local attorney for the company and it is the largest sum of money that has ever been paid into the county at any one time.

To Aid President

Atlantic City, N. J., Nov. 17.—A movement to throw the entire organized farming interests of the country to the support of President Roosevelt in his efforts for an adjustment of railroad tariffs began at today's session of the National Grange Patrons of Husbandry. Three resolutions all of them introduced with the idea of unifying the agricultural strength, were introduced and after spirited discussions were referred to committees for revision and amendment.

Queer Funeral

Philadelphia, Nov. 17.—During the inquest held in the case of John Forkin and Joseph Garcia, laborers who were killed at the Midvale steel works on November 10, it was testified that the two men had entered a pit and that 80,000 pounds of hot metal poured from a leak completely absorbed them. Not a trace of the bodies was discovered. The company has decided to take about 8000 pounds of the steel from the place where the men were last seen and have it buried out of respect to the dead men.

Wants Statehood

Tucson, Ariz., Nov. 17.—A number of leading business and professional citizens held a meeting to organize a campaign in the interest of immediate statehood for Arizona, on the best terms congress will give. The meeting adopted the following resolution:

"Resolved, That we favor the admission of Arizona as a state in the Union upon such terms as congress may grant, even accepting annexation of New Mexico, rather than remain any longer in a territorial condition."
