Tellurium

Tellurium was first discovered in 1872 by Mueller von Reichstein in a specimen of gold ore from Austria. Tellurium occurs free, but more commonly in combination with gold, silver, lead and bismuth. Boulder, Colorado, has produced quite a considerable native tellurlum. The most important of the tellurium minerals, however, are the fold tellurides, sylvanite, colaverite and krennerite,




