## BUYS GOODS FROM US

(Scripps News Association)  
Washington, Dec. 4.—Special agent Charles M. Pepper, of the Department of Commerce and Labor, is just back from a tour through the Canadian Northwest.

Just now, he says, the Canadians are attempting to prevent the natural flow of traffic from the Canadian Northwest southward across the border into and through the States.

A movement is underway, he says, to secure a duty on American rough lumber imported into Canada equal to that laid by the United States on Canadian lumber imported into this country; that is, \$2 per thousand. If this fails, the aim is to obtain a tariff impost of some kind so that the lumber shipments from Washington and Oregon may be brought within the provisions of the anti-dumping clause.

With all the opposition to American goods Mr. Pepper says ever factory is a catalogue of American goods. A sawmill in Vancouver, for instance, draws its supplies as follows: steel plates, Washington, Pa.; grindstones, Cleveland, Ohio; milling machinery, Seattle, Wash.; saw gummies, Tacoma, Wash.; saw anvils, Trenton, N. J.; blanks for band saws, Brooklyn, N. Y.; and fire bricks, Troy, N. Y.

### 250th Anniversary

London, Dec. 4.—A notable dinner takes place at the Hotel Great Central tonight in celebration of the 250th anniversary of the resettlement of the Jews in England. Leading Jews throughout the United Kingdom will attend. It was on this date, in 1655, that Oliver Cromwell, on the intercession of Menasseh ben Israel, the Amsterdam rabbi, granted permission to the Jews to return to England.

### Jewish Day of Mourning

Chicago, Ill., Dec. 4.—The most general observance of its kind that has taken place in this country since the death of President McKinley takes place today when the Jews everywhere observe the day as a day of mourning for their afflicted brethren in Russia. The observance is the result of an appeal issued by the Central Conference of American Rabbis through its president, Rabbi Joseph Stoltz of this city.

### Killed Wrong Man

San Antonio, Texas, Dec. 4.—The case of J. M. Chittim was called for trial today. Chittim, who is a well known stockman, is charged with murder, the charge growing out of the killing of a traveling salesman while Chittim was shooting at another party.

### Owen Retired

Washington, Dec. 4.—Major William O. Owen, in the medical department of the army, and now on duty at the Presidio of Monterey, California, has been placed on the retired list on account of disability. Lieutenant Charles N. Barney, assistant surgeon, on duty in the Philippines, has been ordered home and will go to Fort Bayard, N. M., for his health.

### New Trust Company

New York, Dec. 4.—The newly organized Columbia Trust Company began business today with a paid in capital of \$1,000,000 and a surplus of \$1,000,000. Many prominent men are interested in the new institution, among them are Attorney General William H. Moody and A. B. Hepburn, former Comptroller of the Currency.
