## MILLIONS READY FOR IRRIGATION

Thirty-seven million dollars for irrigation. This amount, as shown by the following table, is the estimated figure of the appropriation for irrigation work which will be available in the fiscal year of 1908, the sum realized from the sale of western public lands since the year of the passage of the irrigation law.

The estimates for 1906, 1907 and 1908 are made by the General Land Office.

This fund is, according to the law, to be invested by the Secretary of the Interior, in feasible irrigation projects which will repay the amount to the government, in ten annual installments from the settlers.

The apportionment of the fund by Secretary Hitchcock has been practically completed and the plans matured for expanding the entire fund on certain definite projects in the west, which practically brings to an end further surveys and examinations and permits the concentration of effort of the Reclamation Service on the building of a few important projects.

### CLEVER BANK SWINDLER

A clever bank swindler who has been working under the name of Charles Sargeant, and who has so far evaded arrest, is supposed to be in some of the northwest cities, and all banks are being notified to look out for him.

Sargeant's scheme is said to be a new one. A day or two before his arrival in a city one or more of the banks get a telegram from some well known eastern banking house, reading as follows: "Honor Chas. Sargeant's check against us for \$50."

The bank, of course, places the telegram on file and when Mr. Sargeant appears the next day with another telegram addressed to himself, saying the money has been placed to his credit in the bank, the cashier, nine times out of ten, pays the money without question.

It is said Sargeant has cleaned up several thousand dollars in the last few months. The Pinkertons have been called to work on the case.

Sargeant is an American, 25 years of age, and weighs 135 pounds, has a dark complexion, and is dressed like a well-to-do business man.
