DAIRYING INCREASING IN GRANDE RONDE VALLEY

500,000 Pounds Last Year, Produced of 2,500 cows, Valued At \$150,000. La Grande Consumes 65,000 Pounds.

500,000 pounds of butter made in Grande Ronde valley. The product of 2500 dairy cows. Few are aware the dairy products of the valley were \$80,000 pounds and as the creameries do not make all of the butter it is a conservative estimate that the entire product will exceed 500,000 pounds.

Mr. Geo. D. Goodhue, who is recognized as authority on dairy subjects, is in the city today, and makes the unqualified statement that Grande Ronde valley is increasing her dairy products at a greater ratio than any other section of the Pacific coast. But he states that there is no danger whatever of the market being overstocked as during the last twelve months Seattle has imported from the east 35 cars, Portland 32, Spokane 23 and Tacoma 10, in all 2,700,000 pounds of butter and that the demand for butter is increasing much faster than the increase in the number of dairy cows.

Mr. Harper, proprietor of the La Grande creamery states that the city of La Grande consumed last year 65,000 of creamery butter and that the product of the valley creameries was 380,000 pounds and brought not less than \$114,000.

Mr. Goodhue states that the creamery business has practically been revolutionized during the past eight years caused by the introduction of the cream separator. The old time policy of hauling fresh milk to the creameries being entirely done away with and that today there are about 300 separators in daily use in this county.

Under present conditions, not being able to supply the large cities of the coast the foreign market has never been sought after but possibly in time as dairying develops this coast will not only manufacture sufficient to supply the home trade but will ship a large amount across the waters.

Dairying in Grande Ronde is rapidly increasing and will continue to increase for many years.
