## STATE AND COUNTY OFFICERS

The necessary preliminary to every man's candidacy is that he shall be put forward for a nomination by petition of at least 2 per cent of the votes cast in June 1904, for his party's nominees for Congress, in the state at large, or a county, or a judicial district or a state senatorial or representative or congressional district as the case may be.

The candidate who shall enter the primary in this manner and shall receive the most votes of his party for the nomination, will be the nominee of his party and will be voted for in the usual manner at the June election.

The number of signers required on a Republican primary petition for a state nomination will be 1000, the maximum required by law; on a Democratic petition, 599. Candidates for a Republican nomination in the First Congressional district must each secure 479 signatures, and in the second district 543. Candidates for the Democratic nomination must each obtain 543 signatures in the First district, and 256 in the second.

### JUDICIAL DISTRICTS

The Second Judicial district will elect a successor to Judge L. T. Harris; the Fourth will elect successors to Judge M. C. George and Judge A. F. Sears, Jr.; the Sixth a successor to Judge W. R. Ellis; the Eighth, a successor to Judge Samuel White; and the Tenth, a successor to Prosecuting Attorney Clarence Crawford. These are the only judicial districts which will hold elections.

### IP-NOTS-WE-NON-MI DEAD

Ip-nots-we-non-mi, mother of Umapine, sub-chieft of the Umatillas, died yesterday on the reservation, after having been ill but a short time. The dead woman was 78 years of age at the time of her death, and was widely known. Her son, Umapine, is one of the most influential and respected Indians of the reservation. The funeral services occurred this afternoon, the interment being in the Indian cemetery near Cayuse-Pendleton East Oregonian.

### AGAINST SUNDAY FUNERALS

Spokane Dec. 12—Rev. Henry I. Rasmus of the First Methodist Episcopal church will introduce a motion at the ministers' meeting to be held this afternoon in the First Baptist church, Lincoln street and Second avenue, calling for concerted action on the part of the clergy to abolish Sunday funerals.
