THE RATE BILL WILL GO THROUGH THIS CONGRESS

Republican Leaders Fear if They Don't, Democrats Will Support the President's Bill and Secure Portion of the Glory

... undertakings, of vital importance to Union county has been directed through his organization. La Grande, being the metropolis of this wealthy and energetic county, many public undertakings are naturally expected to be taken up and pushed to a successful conclusion by this city and to meet such contingencies the maker of Ohio held a conference last week in which they admitted to each other and to themselves that they might as well accept the inevitable and agree to the enactment of the President's plan into legislation at this coming session of congress. Senator Cullom is said to have drafted a bill which is to be the basis of the measure to be finally passed by the senate. This bill confers upon the interstate commerce commission the authority to make a new rate when the existing rate has been found to be unreasonable, and to

fix not only maximum reasonable rates, but minimum reasonable rates to prevent unjust discrimination. It provides that the rate shall go into effect not less than ten days nor more than thirty days after it is formally promulgated. The courts are to be made accessible for review in case the railroad or the shipper seeks to appeal from the commission. This change in the attitude of men like Aldrich and Foraker, and it is said also to include Elkins, is attributed to the conclusion that the President's railroad program is going to pass the senate by Democratic votes if it fails of general Republican support and the senate leaders realize that it will not do to allow the Democrats to claim credit for having given the country legislation which is so generally favored as this.

LONG DISTANCE RACE

Long distance races are still held once in a while in Yankee land. A Massachusetts paper says: Henry Sawyer of Marlboro, in a race against time with his little mare, won \$300 last week by driving her from Marlboro to the union passenger station in Worcester, sixteen miles, in 57 minutes. The race against time was the outcome of a discussion which Mr. Sawyer had with Mitchell Blanchard of Marlboro regarding the ability of the mare. Mr. Blanchard claimed the mare could not cover the distance in an hour, and Mr. Sawyer took him and the arrangements for the race were made. Mr. Sawyer and his mare were started from Marlboro by train, and Mr. Blanchard came up on the electric but the mare beat him out by a minute. Patrick Regan of Worcester was referee, and the timer at the Worcester end of the race was Joseph Champney. The mare finished the race in good condition.

PLANS TO RAISE \$1,000,000

Denver, Dec. 13.—The executive board of the Western Federation of Miners last night decided to submit a proposition to the unions to raise a fund of \$1,000,000 with which to embark in the mining business on a co-operative basis. The plan is said to have each member of the Federation contribute \$10. One of the benefits of the plan, the committee believes, will be to give employment to members of the union who are deprived of work by reason of the card system in use in Colorado and other states.
