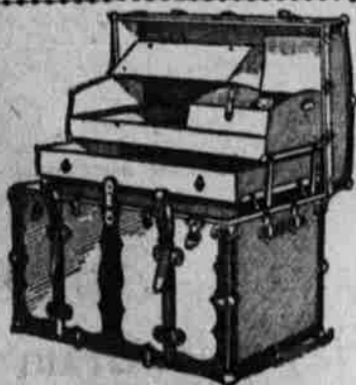

**AGAINST
CONTRACT
SURGEONS**

Washington, Dec. 18.—Secretary Taft today sent to the senate a letter from Major General Leonard Wood commending the proposed legislation to increase the efficiency of the medical corps of the army. General Wood opposes the employment of contract surgeons, declaring the system "a makeshift and an expensive one, as is our policy of expansion of the medical department in time of war through the employment of inexperienced medical men. These gentlemen, whatever their attainments, know little of army methods or of handling large bodies of men, and we have always paid for their education in time of war by an enormous expenditure of men and money, with its resulting embarrassment in the way of inefficient troops and a large pension list."

THOROUGHLY TELLING TESTIMONY.

We might as well abandon the idea that drugs cure. I do not claim that they are of no use. The whip may be of use to the jaded horse to get him over a rough place, and the sledge hammer may be a merciful means of relieving the suffering of a dumb animal. But are such procedures scientific or humanitarian—Right Way.

ENGLISH DOCKYARDS STRIKE

Portsmouth, Eng. Dec. 18.—A strike was inaugurated at the dock yard here today among the men who are building the battleship Dreadnaught, on which work is being pushed with all speed, although the exact reason for the unusual haste has not transpired. The men have been required to work over time and Friday evening the riveters decided that their pay was inadequate and refused to resume work until their grievance was adjusted. After some delay this morning their chief promised to recommend the reform today requested, whereupon the men returned to their labors. This, it is said, is the first time a strike has taken place at the royal dockyards.

WHISTLER PORTRAIT SOLD

London, Dec. 18.—The famous Whistler portrait of the late Sir Henry Irving as King Philip II of Spain was sold at auction today among the remainder of the actor's effects for \$25,000. Sargent's portrait of Ellen Terry in the character of Lady MacBeth realized \$6,300. The "Whistler" picture goes to America.

FATAL EXPLOSION

Marquette, Mich., Dec. 18.—Five men were killed here today by an explosion at the Dupont company's dynamite works.

ALL BUT ONE LOST

Tunis, Dec. 18.—The Norwegian steamer Albulva was lost off the shores of Kelebia and all were lost save one passenger.
